There are hamfests scheduled virtually every weekend around the nation throughout the year. Most are of the half-day flea market variety. Rochester area amateurs are fortunate to have one of the largest hamfests in the nation in their own back yard. There are only a handful of events the size of the Rochester Hamfest.

In addition to a huge flea market, there are national commercial exhibitors, programs and seminars, amateur testing, an awards banquet, and many other special events.

Plan now to attend a terrific weekend of amateur radio events. Tell your out of town friends we have a special negotiated rate of only \$69 for hotel rooms at hamfest headquarters, the Holiday Inn Rochester South.

Tickets available at the gate are only \$9 (U.S.). A 200 sq. ft. (10'x20') flea market parking space is only \$10 (U.S.). Multiple spaces must be purchased for larger vehicles or

RaRa Rag 20 Years Ago, May 1983

This issue featured a full page reporting of the STPR, the Susquehanna Trail Pro Rally, and a sport car event centered on Wellsboro, PA. This article, penned by Ron Jakubowski, K2RJ, compared the radio planning and logistics to that required of the worse Civil Defense disaster. RaRa initially supported this event with most all operators, portable repeaters and powerful portable base stations. Today local PA operators make up the bulk of the hams providing needed communications. The program for the May meeting was presented jointly by Joel Swartz, KA2GAX, and Alan Komenski, AC2K, who described the *Courage Handi-Ham* system. Ed Gable, K2MP, as Chair. Of the RaRa Nominating Committee, offered the following slate for the following year: Vice-President Ray Roberts, WA2SSU, Secretary Alan Komenski, AC2K, Treasurer Bob O'Neil, KA2NBK, Directors N2DPF, WB2EFU, W2EBF, N2EH, K2RJ, KA2KGM and N2BEJ. Writing for the JCC ARC, Dave, N3CKH, was looking for ham volunteers for the 3rd annual Human Race. It must have been picnic season as RaRa announced their annual event for June 4th at Powder Mill Park while the VHF Group planned theirs for May 14th at Mendon Ponds. Speaking of the RVHFG, their new officers were Chair. Ed Mahar, WB2ZJY, VP Ed Kohl, WA2UBD and Scty/Treasurer Joan Place KA2QHF. On May 21st the 20 meter band saw new voice expansions with Extras getting 14.150 to 14.175, Advanced Class to 14.225 and Generals 14.225 and above. Lee Van Grol, WA2YEK, writing for SKYLARC (Second area Young Ladies Amateur Radio Club) reported scheduling a luncheon on Hamfest day for YL's and OM's alike. RaRa Readers should note that the 12 volt connector mentioned in the April RaRa Rag is NOT recommended by lead amateur radio organizations. The ARRL Emergency Communication course and may RACES/ARES organizations recommend the Anderson Powerpole connectors. Otherwise the article was very good to point out the reasons for standardizing power connectors. Several local hams had switched to the Anderson Powerpole connectors and put their equipment to use at Rochester Red Cross shelters during the ice storm of 2003. Amateur radio voice bulletins are available to local hams on the VHF-FM and UHF-FM bands twice a week. Anyone with a FM ham set or a scanner can receive them. Hams can keep up-to-date. Those wishing to become hams can find out when classes and exam sessions are held. A schedule of Hamfests is included for those wishing to socialize and browse


On Sunday nights, bulletins and the Monroe County FM Net are held to keep the local gang informed and to test equipment. Bulletins begin around 8:20pm with the "Newline 2002/2003" brought by Ray, WA2MYG. They continue with the "Hilltop Bulletin" from Dwight, K2KWK at 8:45pm. These weekly features alternate from Sunday to Sunday on local repeaters. When they appear on the 146.88 system of the RRRRA, they are also linked to the mega-repeaters of Bob, N2HJD on nine amateur bands. On the alternate Sundays they use the K2SA repeater of The Genesee Repeater Association on 146.79.

Tuesday bulletin sessions begin at 8:00pm with the same features from WA2MYG and K2KWK. They appear on the Bristol Mtn. repeater, WR2AHL, 145.110 (pl tone 110.9 required) of Mike, W2HYP. That is linked up full time to the repeater of Greg, KE2VW, operating on 146.67 (pl tone 107.2 required) from a very high location south of the communities of Dunkirk and Fredonia. These two systems enable hams from Syracuse to Erie, PA to hear bulletins that include selected stories from the ARRL Letter and ARRL web site.
