I knew it was going to be a night to remember when I pulled into the fire hall parking lot. It was 6:25 pm and already there were 30-40 people waiting in the dark for the doors to open. There was no mistake about it. It was auction night!

Rewind to 7:00 am earlier that day. I met Lloyd, N2PU; Chet, WB2MDO and Jim, W2COP at the guard station entrance to the Monroe County Social Services office building at 111 Westfall Rd. Down the freight elevator to the basement level, around the corner to the main corridor, there was the sign on the door: K2JD.

The first thing that catches your eye when you walk through the doorway is the main operating station console: Icom IC-765 with matching speaker, power supply, amplifier, rotator control, key and microphone. On the wall above the console are contest award plaques and QSL cards from far parts of the globe.

We began the task of disconnecting and moving approximately 70 pieces of equipment out to carts stationed in the hallway. Several county workers stopped by the doorway, craning their necks to see what was going on in this mysterious room that hasn't been opened more than a dozen times since the events of 9/11 demanded increased security and limited access to the building. When work was done, we wheeled the carts back up the freight elevator to the loading dock and into vehicles for the trip up E. Henrietta Rd. to the fire hall; not before one last walk-through for forgotten items in the station. On a somber note we turned off the lights and locked the door leaving behind empty operating consoles, and roof-top runs of coax that would never again mate with an SO-239.

That evening when the crowd waiting outside the fire hall entered the meeting room they swarmed around 12 six-ft. tables covered with club station equipment. You could feel the anticipation as members checked their wallets and you could hear conversations here and there reminiscing the good times sitting at one of the club operating positions, displays glowing and the sounds of DX crackling in the air. More

people came through the doors and more chairs were setup to accommodate them. At 7: 30 pm there were over one hundred RaRa club members in the hall when the announcement was made: "Ladies and Gentlemen, please take your seats. The auction is about to begin."

A noticeable hush permeated the room. Esteemed auctioneers, Ed Gable, K2MP and Bob Hobday, N2EVG, raised the first item for sale. "Going once. Going twice. Gone!" The first item in what was destined to be the greatest auction in RaRa history was now in the hands of a new owner. As the night progressed we witnessed piece after piece of vintage equipment sell for amazing prices including:

Throughout the evening we were entertained and held captive by our knowledgeable and eloquent auctioneers. Highlights for me were the many side notes from our sometimes misty-eyed auctioneer and Club Historian as he recounted stories and provided candid insight into many of the milestone events of a bygone club station era inspired by each piece of equipment up for sale. More importantly were the smiles from the lucky high-bidders who happily opened their wallets at the cashier table. According to RaRa Treasurer, Dick Goslee, KG2I, the total value of all items sold was over \$8,300.00, far surpassing the values of any auction in the history of the club.

Yes, higher prices could have been generated through judicious placement on eBay and other Ham Radio auction sites, but your Board of Directors rightfully voted to give RaRa members first crack at a piece of RaRa Club Station history. In the end, it was clear that they made the right decision; the right decision for RaRa and the right decision for RaRa members. Congratulations to the Directors for their insight and to the lucky winning bidders for their generosity and support of their club.

For days afterwards you could often hear the chatter on local repeaters; tales recounting the events of the evening, vintage equipment sold at unbelievable prices and tales of the one that

got away; a fitting tribute to the success of the event.

My personal thanks to all who contributed to the success of this auction behind the scenes; especially Jim, W2COP; Lloyd, N2PU; Chet, WB2MDO; Irv, AF2K and the RaRa Officers and Board of Directors.

Special thanks to Ed, K2MP; Bob, N2EVG; Frank, WB2PYD and Jeanette, KC2RSZ; Irv, AF2K; Greg, KC2GXV; Tom, KA2GXX; Brad, KB2CHY and anyone else that I may have forgotten for their tireless work on auction night to insure a smooth running and enjoyable event.

RaRa Rag 20 Years Ago, December, 1987

Come See the Light was the opening title for this issue and appropriate is was. This meeting, hosted by the Kodak ARC and held at the Bldg. 28 venue in Kodak Park, was a talk by Mr. Gregory Pierce of the U of R, speaking on Electro-optic Cable TV Systems.

Lloyd Caves, WB2EFU, reported that the current membership stands at 935 and that this would be your last Rag if you had not already renewed. Could there be an Amateur for Vice-President of the United States ? Yes, if Wayne Green, W2NSD, had his way. Wayne, the controversial Editor of 73 Magazine, announced he was throwing his hat in the ring by entering the New Hampshire primary. News flash... he lost.

Pictured in this issue were Al Crum W2BWK, Sax Ringler W2SAW and George Batterson W2GB. The occasion was a celebration of W2BWK's 73rd birthday. Al's radio operating career started in 1914 when he was a wireless operator for the Goodyear Tire company and later worked for Marconi until WW2. Al Crum was later a professional photographer and much of his early work appeared in the RaRa Rag and the AWA Old Timers' Bulletin.

An interesting report told the success story of an application of PRB-1 in a Long Island court case. K2LE was denied his 80 foot tower and a Federal Judge reversed the decision saying the township failed to state any cause for doing so and failed to make any effort to reasonable accommodation as required by PRB-1.

It was with regret that James Taylor, KC2U, was reported as a silent key. Jim was well known to amateurs from WNY as the always helpful and supportive engineer from the FCC office in Buffalo. Sidebands: Amateur Radio in the News

Remnants of Hurricane Noel Hit Northeastern US: After slamming into Cuba, Puerto Rico and the Bahamas, Noel (by then an Extratropical Storm) hit portions of Eastern New England November 3. Winds up to hurricane force caused significant tree and power line damage along with minor structural damage. The hardest hit areas were Southeast and East Coastal Massachusetts as well as Southeastern Rhode Island. Noel, which had been a Category 1 hurricane after it passed through the Bahamas, transitioned into a major “Nor’easter” system, passing less than 100 miles southeast of Nantucket Island off the coast of Massachusetts. ARRL Eastern Massachusetts Section Emergency Coordinator and SKYWARN Coordinator for the National Weather Service (NWS) in Taunton, Rob Macedo, KD1CY, stated that ARES, RACES and SKYWARN groups in Eastern Massachusetts were activated Saturday [November 3] morning. “Activation of SKYWARN started at 7 AM with operations at our NWS Taunton Ham Station, WX1BOX, with weather conditions deteriorating after 10 that morning.” Carl Aveni, N1FY, and Phil McLaughlin, KB1CYO, assisted with operations at the NWS Taunton office. With sustained strong winds at 25-35 MPH and gusts up to 60 MPH across Eastern and Southern Coastal Massachusetts and Southeastern Rhode Island that caused damage to trees and power lines, there were pockets of power outages across portions of the region; rainfall totals of 1-2 inches were common. Conditions on Cape Cod, Nantucket and Martha's Vineyard were far worse. Winds gusted well into hurricane force resulting in widespread power outages and structural damage, including damage to trees and power lines. “We received a report from the Nantucket Harbormaster of a 90 MPH measured gust in the Madaket section on the western part of the island,” said Nantucket

RACES Radio Officer and ARES Emergency Coordinator George Allen, N1NBQ. Allen and several other amateurs manned the Nantucket EOC for the entire event. “Nantucket Island sustained a high-end moderate coastal flood event with lower-end moderate coastal flooding over Cape Cod and the Islands and Southeast Plymouth County Massachusetts,” Macedo said. Cape Cod ARES District Emergency Coordinator and Cape Cod Red Cross Communications Officer Frank O’Laughlin, WQ1O, said, “I had a wind gust of 89 MPH at my home in the Marstons Mills section of Barnstable before having my anemometer ripped off the tower and blown several houses down and destroyed.” Roof damage to a few structures was reported in Falmouth and Fairhaven, Massachusetts as well as Nantucket Island. The police communications tower in Harwich blew down due to the hurricane force gusts. With the Cape Cod Red Cross using call sign K1PBO and Dan Howard, K1DYO, serving as Net Control, the 146.955 repeater in Dennis was active from 9:30 AM Saturday through 12:30 AM EDT Sunday [November 4] doing hourly roll calls of various EOCs. In between roll calls, he received other reports of damage and flooding. “Several shelters were opened, but not many people utilized them. Amateur Radio operators covered the Red Cross headquarters and also a couple of the most vulnerable shelters that may have a loss of communication capability,” Macedo said.

Motorola to Acquire Vertex Standard/Yaesu: According to a press release issued by Motorola, Motorola USA has announced its intention to “launch a tender offer to acquire a controlling interest in Vertex Standard Co, Ltd.” Vertex Standard is the parent company of Yaesu. Upon successful completion of the tender offer and subsequent restructuring process, Motorola will own 80 percent of Vertex Standard. Tokogiken, a privately held Japanese company, controlled by current president and CEO of Vertex Standard Jun Hasegawa, will retain 20 percent, forming a joint venture. The total purchase price for 80 percent of the outstanding shares will be approximately 12.3 billion yen (roughly US \$108 million). The bid will start November 6 and end on December 26. If the bid succeeds, shares of Vertex would be removed from the JASDAQ Securities

Exchange in Japan. According to Dennis Motschenbacher, K7BV, Yaesu's Executive Vice President for Amateur Radio Sales in North America, "I thought that the happiest and proudest day of my 45-plus years in Amateur Radio was when I was offered the opportunity to lead the Yaesu North American sales effort; however, being able to now announce this news to my fellow Amateur Radio operators takes over as the top life thrill for me! 
